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Our Board of Trustees is pleased that recently-announced provincial government grants will continue to enhance [Dual Credit programming](#) and create new opportunities for Chinook's Edge students. [Red Deer Advocate](#)

The Board was happy to approve the first application in their Flourishing Stories and Innovation project, and are excited to be reviewing three additional active project submissions. The Board approved \$3,200 for Amy Severtson, a middle school teacher at Bowden Grandview School, for an in-school farmers market to run over two semesters.
