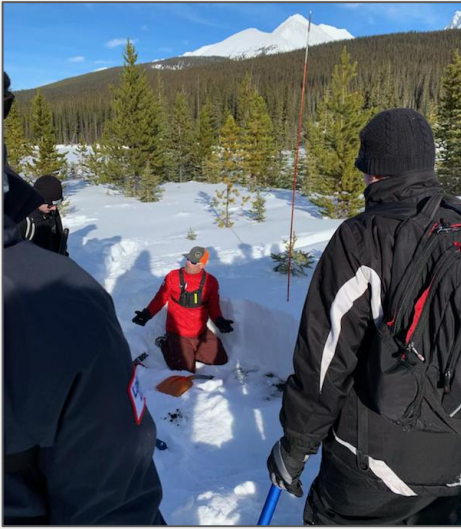


Students take part in specialized outdoor course



Students from Bowden Grandview School, Cremona School and Spruce View School took part in a Winter Travel 15 course, which is offered through Canadian Rockies School Division and hosted in Kananaskis Country.

Students earn high school credits by participating in a variety of winter activities and learning techniques to respond to emergency situations, such as avalanches. They also develop familiarity with navigation and personal safety techniques.

The program is part of a unique and long-standing partnership. The Chinook's Edge technology team provides tech support to Canadian Rockies and the six schools in the Canmore-based division. In turn, Chinook's Edge schools have access to specialized learning opportunities through Canadian Rockies twice each year.
